

## Mini-course in Applied Microeconometrics

### **Aims:**

This short course aims at providing the participants a good understanding of the methodological issues arising in surveys or administrative data when evaluating different social interventions and policies. The main topics covered are randomized field experiments and difference-and-difference estimators. In each case, we discuss the necessary assumptions and the data requirements. The adequacy of each method is discussed drawing on the empirical evidence from the labor market, education and health policy evaluation literature.
